KLRN highlights local issues on KLRN NEWS Updates hosted by award-winning journalist, Shari St Clair. The one-minute news updates provide KLRN viewers with information on the issues that are important to our community. The Friday edition features an additional one-minute update on local business news, hosted by Tony Quesada, Editor-In-Chief of the San Antonio Business Journal. The reports air in prime time Monday through Friday and are broadcast on KLRN's two channels: KLRN HD/PBS and KLRN World.

Newscasts are also produced by students at the KLRN Studio on the campus of Texas A&M International University in Laredo, TX and posted online at www.klrn.org/news.

KLRN Channels

KLRN broadcasts 24 hours a day on 4 channels in South Central Texas.









KLRN Production Services

The KI RN Production team provides uplink services, satellite media tours, and live interviews for both local and national media outlets such as ESPN, CNN, and MSNBC.





Early Childhood

Ready, Set, Grow! Since 2009, KLRN has presented Play & Learn, a free city-wide, mobile school readiness program. Families receive free books and take-home activities each week. This year, KLRN presented over 100 early childhood activities; over 2,000 adults and children in their care attended the Play & Learn program.

Bright By Text KLRN is one of seven PBS pilot stations to launch Bright By Text, a program that sends texts with child development tips and resources to 1,800+ subscribers. The project was supported by the Corporation for Public Broadcasting and the United Way of San Antonio & Bexar County.

KLRN's Learning Neighborhood San Antonio was selected as the pilot community for a national project through a partnership with PBS and Committee for Children. Phase 1 of KLRN's Learning Neighborhood began in Fall 2018 and will continue through 2019.

KLRN's PBS KIDS Early Learning Champion This program recognizes educators who work with young children and offers a variety of community building, leadership, and professional learning opportunities provided by PBS and member stations. We are excited to work with our first recipient, Susanne Tata from Alamo Heights Presbyterian Church Day School!




School Services

PBS LearningMedia: KLRN provides free access to PBS LearningMedia, a digital library that houses thousands of educational resources that include videos designed specifically for the classroom, interactives and lesson plans. All lesson plans are aligned to the Texas Essential Knowledge & Skills. Teachers can save the resources and find professional development resources. Currently, there are 24,000+ registered users in our community. Since launching, KLRN has contributed content to the platform, with 54 educational assets to the service.

The Healthy Kids Project: This year, KLRN grew our partnership with Edgewood ISD, Northside ISD, and Northeast ISD. Together, we reached over 8,000 students and 500+ classrooms. KLRN also partnered with the United Way of San Antonio; ten parenting programs adopted the curriculum and over 1,600 families were impacted. This year, KLRN trained 625 teachers, parents, and family members through workshops at KLRN and in partnership with elementary schools. The project was supported by the San Antonio Medical Foundation and the San Antonio Area Foundation.

Dinosaur George: "Dinosaur George: Museum in the Classroom" gives students the unique opportunity to see exhibits of prehistoric life. KLRN and Dinosaur George partner to bring classroom ready resources for campuses to utilize before, during and after their school visit. In 2018, Dinosaur George hosted more than 60 events and over 45,000 students and 16,000 adults explored exhibits of prehistoric life!

Cyberchase: Mobile Adventures in STEM! With support from WNET, KLRN presented two professional development trainings for 1st-3rd grade teachers to introduce them to Cyberchase resources. In Spring 2018, more than 150 elementary teachers opted into the Mobile Adventures in STEM program. They received a series of text messages that connected them with free resources on PBS LearningMedia.

PBS NewsHour Student Reporting Labs KLRN and Somerset ISD teamed up to pilot an after school program at Savannah Heights Intermediate School. The program is the KLRN PBS NewsHour Student Reporting Lab and the students were 5th and 6th graders. Students learned about responsible reporting, media, journalism, and about the importance of team work and attendance. The initiative was tied to a high school completion grant supported by the San Antonio Area Foundation.





Professional Development

PBS KIDS Edcamp KLRN hosted 265 teachers at 2 PBS KIDS Edcamp workshops in partnership with Pre-K4SA. Participants proposed topics they wanted to explore as they built an agenda and self-selected the break-out sessions they wanted to attend. Teachers learned new trends in integrating STEAM activities in their classrooms and learned about the importance of valuing children's curiosity, creating meaningful contexts, and building their professional skills. They earned over 1,000 training hours.

Little Bites, Big Steps KLRN integrated The Healthy Kids Project with the Little Bites, Big Steps workshop series. Merging the curriculum, KLRN worked to support childcare providers as we explored how they can integrate healthy living messages for young children, birth to age five—in an effort to prevent childhood obesity. KLRN hosted four sessions for child care providers and elementary teachers from across the community. Together, they earned more than 600 training hours.

Learn with Media KLRN's "Learn with Media" e-newsletter is **sent to over 25,000 educators** each month during the school year. Editions included information about Bullying Prevention, Summer Reading, Black History Month, and KLRN's educational initiatives.

Community Engagement

South Texas SciGirls KLRN brings the SciGirls project to girls ages 8-13 in South Central Texas. The goal of SciGirls is to support young ladies as they explore their interests in science, technology, engineering and math (STEM). This year, SciGirls visited Cibolo Nature Center, the weather studio at KSAT, the Witte Museum and CPS Energy.

KLRN KIDS Events This year, we proudly hosted fifteen community events for KLRN Kids and their families as we partnered with over 65 agencies. We welcomed thousands of people and at each event, a PBS KIDS character made special appearances. Curious George, Peg + Cat and Sid the Science Kid joined us at places like: The DoSeum, Kennedy Park, Normoyle Park and San Pedro Springs Park.

KLRN PBS KIDS Channel On April 1st, KLRN celebrated the 1 year anniversary of the KLRN PBS KIDS channel.

RARE: Creatures of the Photo Ark KLRN hosted 3 screenings to promote RARE. We partnered with Mitchell Lake Audubon Center and Cibolo Nature Center to host the screenings. It was a special project as we produced a local 15-minute segment in partnership with San Antonio Zoo. KLRN also hosted it's first ever Instagram Contest; viewers submitted original photos of animals and tagged KLRN; over 380 photos were submitted.

kirno Veterans

USO/Pathfinder Luncheon KLRN co-hosted a luncheon for over 100 military, transitioning military and community members— through a partnership with the USO and the Pathfinder Program. We previewed a special screening of upcoming PBS programs and shared a presentation about our Veterans Voices initiative. At the event, the audience was able to network and create healthy connections to explore opportunities as they transition from the military.

The Vietnam War: Professional Development Trainings

KLRN proudly hosted 2 professional development training for high school teachers, middle school teachers and college professors. The audience earned 90 training hours as they examined resources made available from the Ken Burns & Lynn Novick documentary: The Vietnam War. All resources can be found on PBS LearningMedia.

The Great American Read

What is America's favorite book? KLRN took part in finding out which novel Americans would choose as their favorite with PBS's multiplatform project – The Great American Read. The television and online series sparked a national conversation about reading and the books that have inspired, moved, and shaped us.

From May - October, KLRN attended 28 events around San Antonio and Boerne, **reaching an estimated 70,000 people** of all ages. In our commitment to education, KLRN gave away over 2,200 books to children to help grow family libraries and boost summer reading.

During the campaign, KLRN held a book drive and collected over 200 books for three local literacy organizations: Each One Teach One, San Antonio Youth Literacy, and Boys & Girls Club to increase awareness of agencies that strive to make San Antonio illiterate-free. We also partnered with Girl Scout Troop 300 to decorate and adopt 15 Little Free Libraries which were installed in different parts of the city.

Shakespeare Uncovered

KLRN received a grant to promote and celebrate the work of William Shakespeare through the program "Shakespeare Uncovered."

KLRN partnered with The Magik Theatre, The Classic Theatre, Teatro Audaz, and UTSA's Friends of Shakespeare. KLRN hosted "A Night Of Shakespeare" on September 25, 2018 at The Public Theater of San Antonio. We invited our main performing arts organization partners to perform excerpts from Shakespeare plays. Informational tables were set up for people to learn more about the Shakespeare scene in San Antonio. After four live performances, and a panel discussion, we held a preview screening of the "Much Ado About Nothing" episode of the series.

Over 200 people joined us for the event, including several high school theater arts groups. Our community was thrilled with the opportunity to see and discuss the work of Shakespeare. A group of people formed to hold future events and discussions similar to ours.

Lorraine Hansberry Sighted Eyes/ Feeling Heart

KLRN was selected as one of four PBS stations to receive the *Lorraine Hansberry: Sighted Eyes/Feeling Heart* local production and outreach initiative grant. KLRN created a multi-media and multi-platform project that engaged drama students as well as the general public.

We presented a film preview of the documentary **co-hosted with the DreamWeek activists** at the Alamo Drafthouse Park
North, January 15. The discussion was moderated by Danielle
King, from The Renaissance Guild, and panelists included: Gregg
Barrios, playwright, Yvette Benavides, Professor of English, and
Antoinette Winstead, Professor of Drama and Mass
Communications. An additional preview screening was held at
the Carver Library in San Antonio, on February 15.

KLRN partnered with **The Renaissance Guild** to facilitate playwriting workshops with a group of theatre arts students. We selected to work with Christopher Reese's students at Sam Houston High School. In mid-January 2018, the Renaissance Guild's Antoinette Lakey facilitated **a three-day writing workshop for students**. The focus of the workshop was to gain inspiration from the work and life of Lorraine Hansberry to create a piece that students could perform in-person.
