In Their Own Words

There are myriad ways to create a biography. One of the most engaging is to highlight words spoken by the subject.

In this six-episode series In Their Own Words, Season 2, quotes by 20th-century icons shed new light on key moments of their lives — exploring their complex personalities and illuminating their impact on history.

The innovative use of quotations in combination with interviews and archival videos will take you into the lives of such greats as Elon Musk, Angela Merkel, President Jimmy Carter, Princess Diana, Pope Francis, and Chuck Berry.

You'll learn fascinating details about **Elon Musk** and how he went from a person of modest means to one of the richest people in the world. During his career, he has co-founded and headed numerous companies in the electric vehicle, aerospace, and artificial intelligence fields including Tesla, SpaceX, The Boring Company, OpenAI, and others.

Angela Merkel has been called the most powerful woman in the world. She is the first female chancellor of Germany and has served since 2005. Merkel emphasizes strengthening international economic relations and has played a crucial role in managing the global financial crisis and the European debt crisis.

Jimmy Carter, who was president of the United States from 1977 to 1981, established a comprehensive national energy policy and pardoned the Vietnam War draft evaders during his term. His presidential tenure was marked by the Iran hostage crisis, Three Mile Island nuclear accident, and the Soviet invasion of Afghanistan. President Carter is recognized worldwide for his decades of humanitarian work since he left office.

Diana, Princess of Wales (Diana Frances Spencer), was the first wife of Charles, Prince of Wales. Her beauty, activism, and glamorous lifestyle made her an international iconic figure whose stature never faded through their separation and ultimate divorce. She died in a tragic car crash in 1997 when she was only 36.

Pope Francis is head of the Catholic Church and sovereign of the Vatican City state. Born in Buenos Aires, Argentina, he worked as a bouncer and janitor before training to be a chemist. After recovering from a severe illness, he was inspired to join the Jesuits. He was elected as Pope in 2013.

Chuck Berry, nicknamed "the Father of Rock and Roll," was an influential singer, songwriter, and guitarist. He is best known for his 1950s songs "Maybellene," "Roll Over Beethoven," "Rock and Roll Music," and "Johnny B. Goode" — as well as his signature guitar riffs and dazzling showmanship.

The series features an eclectic selection of people — who will give you deeper insights into their unique characters and the worlds in which they've lived. Their stories may even send you searching for more in-depth information.

George "Buddy" Guy is 84, a master of the blues, and one of the most influential guitarists of all time.

American Masters — Buddy Guy:
The Blues Chase The Blues Away
captures the essence of the man and
his music. He was born and raised in
Lettsworth, Louisiana. His parents were
sharecroppers, and as a child Guy would
pick cotton for \$2.50 per 100 pounds.
He began performing in Baton Rouge,
and when he moved to the Midwest in
the 1950s he rose to prominence in the
Chicago blues scene.

Solo commercial success eluded Buddy until the 1990s. He recorded his mainstream album — *Damn Right, I've Got the Blues* — in 1991. Decades of perseverance reflect both the Black experience in twentieth-century America and the history of blues. He still actively tours all over the country and performs numerous shows at his Chicago blues club, Buddy Guy's Legends.

The documentary features both archival and never-before-seen performances by Guy, which include President Obama and The Rolling Stones, and interviews with Eric Clapton, Carlos Santana, and others.

The Vienna Philharmonic Summer Night Concert performed in the magnificent setting of the Schönbrunn Palace is one of the great highlights of the Philharmonic year.

Daniel Harding will conduct the concert for the first time. The theme "Yearning for Distant Places" will feature compositions by Bernstein, Verdi, Rachmaninoff, Sibelius, Elgar, Debussy, and Holst. Soloist is Igor Levit.

The Schönbrunn Palace is a UNESCO World Heritage Site. Located in Hietzing, Vienna, Austria, it was the main summer residence of the Habsburg rulers. The orchestra podium and audience area are located within the baroque park, surrounded by extraordinary scenery.

The Vienna Philharmonic has been closely associated with the history and tradition of European classical music since its founding in 1842. They perform in locations of historical and political significance and much of their music expresses the ideals of peace and humanity.


