C LUCY WORSLEY ON THE MYSTERY QUEEN

Lucy Worsley is a British historian, author, and curator, but she is best known as a television presenter of historical topics on BBC Television and British TV Channel 5, a public broadcast station.

GATHA CHRISTI

In this three-part series, Worsley delves into the life and writings of Agatha Christie. She discovers the origins of Agatha Christie's macabre magic and uncovers carefully concealed clues about the enigmatic English author.

Christie is the best-selling fiction writer of all time, with 2 billion copies of her novels having sold since the release of her first mystery in 1920. She is also the world's most translated author.

In episode 1, Cat Among the Pigeons, Lucy Worsley focuses on the first third of Christie's life, revealing a portrait of the artist as a young woman. She investigates the complex factors that shaped Christie's dark imagination including family secrets and a childhood haunted by a sinister figure. The first episode unearths the surprising roots of Christie's most compelling themes and the secrets she kept hidden from public view.

Like the best Christie stories, Worsley's exploration is replete with suspense, humor, and a fascinating group of people who disclose new information and intrigue during interviews. Family members,

screenwriters, and poison experts share insights into Christie's life and creative drive. Worsley also brings previously hidden "evidence" to the table including personal papers, a lost mortgage deed, and a folded photograph.

Episode 2, Destination Unknown, recounts a shocking event that occurred in the winter of 1926. On the evening of December 3, Christie disappeared from her home in Sunningdale, and the next morning her car was found abandoned several miles away. Ten days later, Agatha was discovered in a hotel nearly 100 miles north in Harrogate, claiming to have lost her memory. Worsley delves into this traumatic moment in Agatha's life, the connections between her real-life experience and her novels, her mental health, and the psychiatric treatment she received.

In episode 3, Unfinished Portrait, Worsley examines Christie's later life. She fell in love with and married Max Mallowan. Christie's newfound personal happiness ushered in the most prolific and successful period for her writing. She achieved global celebrity status, but she also remained an anonymous observer, hiding in plain sight.

Each episode is complex, fascinating, and thoroughly memorable.

Billie Jean King is a world-renowned tennis star who has won 39 Grand Slam titles. She is an outspoken advocate for women's equality in sports. A pioneer and activist, she recognizes the far-reaching scope of Title IX, the game-changing 1972 legislation that prohibits gender-based discrimination for any educational activity that receives federal funding.

In *Groundbreakers*, King brings together some of the leading women athletes for one-on-one conversations about their individual roads to success. Topics discussed include everything from mental health to equal pay to women's choice.

During the program you'll meet Jackie Joyner-Kersee, track and field athlete; Naomi Osaka, tennis professional; Nancy Lieberman, basketball player; Chloe Kim, snowboarder; Diana Flores Arenas, flag football quarterback; Julie Foudy, soccer player; and Sunisa "Suni" Lee, gymnast.

Conversations with these exceptional athletes can teach us more about relevant issues regarding competitive sports and the future of gender equality on and off the playing field.

THREE CHAPLAINS

This outstanding new documentary profiles three Muslim chaplains, including the first female Muslim chaplain in the U.S. military, who support and defend the religious rights of all service members. As the public face of Islam in their roles as chaplains, they combat Islamophobia while promoting interfaith understanding in the military.

Air Force Chaplain Rafael Lantigua has served for more than 20 years. He is a vital resource and confidant for young service members who can turn to him to learn more about Islam, practice their faith, and build resilience.

Army Colonel Khallid Shabazz is a Louisiana native who recently became the U.S. military's highest ranking Muslim cleric. For him, faith and service go hand in hand. He has learned from past challenges including molestation, gun violence, and relentless pressure to inspire action in underrepresented service members.

Newcomer Saleha Jabeen, an immigrant from India, set her sights on becoming the first female Muslim chaplain. She has taken on the challenge despite skepticism from her loved ones and those within her support system.

All three Muslim clerics have risen through the ranks. They serve as symbols for progressive change while challenging long-held notions of what it means to serve your country.
