#### Blanquita Cullum Radio & Broadcast Journalist



The Honorable Blanquita Walsh Cullum is the President and co-founder of Voices Against Trafficking. Ms. Cullum is an award-winning broadcast journalist and host of the podcast, The Hard Question. For eight years, Ms. Cullum served as a Governor on the United States Broadcasting Board of Governors (BBG). She was Nominated by President George W. Bush and was unanimously confirmed by the United States Senate. Governor Cullum is the first Hispanic woman and the first radio talk show host to have served on the BBG. In that

capacity, she also served as Chairman of the Committees on Radio Free Europe, Radio Free Asia and the Middle East Broadcast Network In 2020, she was inducted into the Texas Radio Hall of Fame and received the prestigious "Sammy Award" for outstanding accomplishments for women in broadcasting. Cullum was named "Champion of Radio" by the Multicultural Correspondents Association. Ms. Cullum was honored in the Congressional Record by the late Senator Tom Coburn as a "Champion for the mission of U. S. International Broadcasting".

For 19 years, she has served as emcee of the National Memorial Day Parade in Washington DC honoring our Nation's heroes past and present. Recently, she authored a chapter in the book, "Voices Against Trafficking-The Strength of Many Voices Speaking as One." It is now in the Library of Congress.

Cullum's broadcasting career began in Texas. While she was at University of Texas at Austin, she began as a studio artist at KLRN. After the death of her father, she moved with her mom to San Antonio and took a job as a copywriter for KBUC. Radio station KITE heard her voice on air and offered her a job as co-host to popular morning drive host, Tom East. Her career took her to on air positions with KENS TV, KTSA and KSJL.

In addition to her work with Voices Against Trafficking and The Hard Question, she is in demand as a coach/trainer for national and international broadcasters.

She is the mother of two children Blanquita and James and has four grandchildren.

#### MAJOR GENERAL ANGIE SALINAS U.S. Marine Corps (Retired) CEO, Girl Scouts of Southwest Texas



Angie Salinas, Major General U.S. Marine Corps (Ret.) joined Girl Scouts of Southwest Texas as the Chief Executive Officer in July 2015. Prior to becoming the CEO, she served in the U.S. Marine Corps for 39 years. A woman of many firsts, she made history as the first Latina selected and promoted to the general officer ranks in the Marine Corps and at the time of her retirement in September 2013, she was the senior ranking woman and the senior Hispanic in the Corps.

A Girl Scout alumna, Salinas is a role model to girls and women seeking to break through the glass ceiling. She commanded at every level from Lieutenant to General and is a trailblazer, serving as the first woman in multiple assignments that include Commanding General, Marine

Corps Recruit Depot San Diego/Western Recruiting Region, Assistant Chief of Staff for plans and policy of a major combatant organization, and command of a recruiting district. Her military decorations are many including the Defense Superior Service Medal and culminated with the Navy Distinguished Service Medal upon retirement.

Salinas' accolades extend past her military experience. She has been recognized with multiple awards including the U.S. Hispanic Leadership Institute's Lifetime Achievement Award, the Women's International Center's Living Legacy Award, and the Congressional Hispanic Caucus Institute's Latinas in Service Award. She was named a Top Latino Leader by the National Diversity Council and a TAMACC Woman of Distinction. She has been inducted into the U.S. Veterans Hall of Fame, Hispanic Women in Leadership Hall of Fame, and the San Antonio Women's Hall of Fame. She is a recipient of the NCAA Legacy Award, the American Latino Influencer Valor Award, and the American Spirit Award Medallion from the National WWII Museum. She has received the San Antonio Chamber of Commerce Tribute to Women Business Leaders Hope Award, as well as the San Antonio Business Journal Women's Leadership Award. Salinas has been named one of 15 Phenomenal Women by Latina Magazine and one of six Power Latinas by Vivala.com.

A native of Alice, Texas, she holds a Master of Arts from the Naval War College and a bachelor's degree from Dominican College of San Rafael, California. She was awarded an Honorary Doctor of Laws from Dominican University in 2015 and named a Distinguished Alumni in 2016.
